


### Why should I learn

### Hebrew?



In many of the Jewish schools Hebrew is part of the study plan. But when you ask students what they think about learning the language, they may say "boring" "why do I need this?" "it's useless- everyone in Israel knows English". In the latest study done (by the Avichai Foundation, 2017) they found that out of the students who learn Hebrew in Europe and the USA 80% said they can read the language, but only 15% said they can speak. language more attractive and relevant?








## In what language should we pray?


How can we create a meaningful relationship with Israel?

How can I show my connection and love to Israel in different ways?








## to Judaism

In many communities bringing the younger generations to activities in the Jewish centers is a challenge.












## A connection between Jews around the world






#### **Antisemitism**
