I am Chaya, a Haredi 14 year-old girl. I live in Jerusalem with my parents and my 7 brothers and sisters. Shortly before my Bat Mitzvah, I searched, together with my Mom, for a volunteering project through which I could contribute to the community. I really enjoy crocheting so my Mom suggested that I crochet dolls and give them out to children who are hospitalized long-term. I liked the idea and instantly got to work. Since then, two years have passed and I am still giving out dolls that I crochet to children. The excitement and happiness of the children when they receive the dolls makes me so happy.

Hi, my name is Yonatan. I am 23 years-old and I'm learning Economics and Accounting in the Hebrew University. In the framework of the organization that I volunteer in, I meet with families from weaker populations and teach them how to act wisely with their money. A number of families who I worked with told me that for the first time in their lives they managed to save some money for their children's future. Every family like this causes me to feel happy and proud, and to want to be the best that I can be in what I do in order to help fix the world.

I am Ehud, 44 years old and I grew up in a Kibbutz in the north of the country. I have been working as a farmer for over twenty years. I tend to an apple orchard that has been in our family for many generations. A few years ago I heard that a few teenagers who live in the Youth Village on a nearby Kibbutz were looking for work. After I employed a few of them and I understood that this is the first time that they are working in order to make money, I decided to set up a project that employs them on a fixed basis. The work teaches them discipline and commitment, provides a framework for them and also gives them a monthly income. I would be more than happy to increase the scope of the project and to bring more youth here to work.

I am Daniella, 30, from Tel Aviv. I am a professional actress. A few years ago my grandmother lived in an old age home close to my apartment. I would visit her every day and in order to entertain her and the rest of the residents, I would do little performances and imitations. Sadly, a year ago my grandmother passed away but I didn't stop visiting the old age home. I have a dream to make these visits into something even larger – a regular drama club. A club that will bring happiness to the residents and will make their lives happier and richer. In order to do this, I need a budget that will allow me to buy costumes and accessories and perhaps even a professional camera that would allow us to create films.
