

## Siloam Tunnel

Also known as Hezekiah's Tunnel-is a carved water tunnel in Jerusalem through which the waters of the Gihon Spring passed through under the houses in the City of David, from east to west, for over half a kilometer. The tunnel was carved during the days of King Hezekiah- over 2,700 years ago- and is located in the City of David. The tunnel is known for being "the most impressive water system of all the ancient water systems in the country". The tunnel is unique in that it is the first of its kind in Jerusalem and brought water to its inhabitants from a source found within the city walls- which was of great importance at times of war.

## The Inside of the Library at Hebrew University



# Israel Museum



The Israel Museum is the largest, most important museum in Israel. The museum is located in the Givat Ram neighborhood of Jerusalem and is one of the largest museums in the Middle East. There are about half a million pieces of art displayed in the museum that reflect cultures from around the world- with collections from the fields of archaeology, anthropology, Judaica, Israeli art, world art and changing exhibitions.



## Shrine of the Book



Shrine of the Book- The Shrine of the Book is a wing of the Israel Museum that houses a number of the most important archaeological findings of the twentieth century, including rare, ancient manuscripts such as the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Aleppo Codex. The Shrine of the Book deals, almost entirely, with the lives of ancient Jewish cults.
